



Healthy School Streets

St Paul's Primary School Healthy School Street, Elsworthy Road



Dear Resident/Stakeholder,

We have recently been installing changes to improve road safety in the local area as part of the King Henry's Road Area Safe & Healthy Streets Scheme. You can read the decision report at camden.gov.uk/KHRdecision. We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your patience during this time and to apologise for any inconvenience these works may have caused.

As part of the changes, we are introducing a Healthy School Street outside St Paul's Primary School on Elsworthy Road between Elsworthy Rise and Primrose Hill Road. This involves a timed motor vehicle restriction. These changes are being introduced as an 18-month trial under an Experimental Traffic Order, which allows us to make changes to the scheme.

What changes are we proposing?

Following further discussions with representatives from St Paul's Primary School, it has been agreed that the trial Healthy School Street morning restrictions times should be 8.30am – 9.30am (they had previously been planned to be 8am – 9am but these times and the scheme itself are not yet fully active). This proposed change more closely aligns with the start of the school day. The afternoon restriction time of 3pm - 4pm will remain unchanged.

We are proposing to make this change as an amendment to the existing Experimental Traffic Order. Subject to feedback received during the above two-week local consultation period and approval by the Director of Environment and Sustainability, the relevant changes to the scheme would be made which would mean that the operational hours will be 8.30am – 9.30am and 3pm – 4pm, Mondays to Fridays during school term time only for the remainder of the 18-month trial period. The Healthy School Street and the restrictions will start once the signage is opened, which is planned for later this Autumn, and will be closed during the school holidays. If you live within the restricted section of Elsworthy Road (from Elsworthy Rise to Primrose Hill Road) and have not yet applied for an exemption for your vehicle, please visit camden.gov.uk/healthyschoolstreets.
