


Improving bowel cancer screening for people living with learning disabilities

Bowel cancer awareness







- Some people get a disease called bowel cancer this is a serious Illness you can die from
- Bowel cancer screening helps find bowel cancer at an early stage
- It is your choice to do the test or not you can talk to your family, carer, a nurse or your doctor

Or you can call the freephone number 0800 707 600

 The test looks for tiny amounts of blood in your poo - you can do the test on your own or you can ask someone to help you

Bowel cancer screening



 you will get a screening test kit after you turn 54 years old, every 2 years until you reach 74



we will send you screening test kit



it will include instructions

Ways to collect your poo



with toilet paper



open the kit



a clean empty container



wipe the stick through the poo



catch your poo before it goes in the toilet water



wash your hands with soap

After you take the test



 put your sample into the envelope, and post it back to us



 if your result is **positive**, you will get telephone appointment to talk about your results with a screening nurse



they may offer you more tests at the screening centre







How we are supporting people with LD

we will send you an easy read guide and letters

you can download an easy read guide at www.gov.uk/phe/bowel-screening-easy-read

 we train staff on the bowel screening programme and tell them about reasonable adjustments that can be made – for example we can offer longer appointments at a time that is better for you

 we check our list to see if those who are on this list and if they are not, we can support them to encourage them to do it. E.g Barnet Learning Disability database







Barnet Learning Disability service

- there are **154** people aged **54** to **74**, with LD on their list
- 39 people were not sent a kit
- **56** people sent their sample back
- 59 people did not send their sample back
- the 59 people who did not send their sample back will be contacted by their Health Promotion Nurse, who will encourage them to send a sample back
- of the 59 people who did not send their sample back, 10 have been contacted
- 6 people have asked to have the kit resent
