#### 1. Who is eligible?

- o Age:
  - On the first day of learning a learner must be aged 19 or older on 31 August within the 2025 to 2026 funding year

#### Residence:

- learners must be ordinarily resident in London on the first day of learning
- in limited circumstances we may accept learners who live outside of London as long as they are ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom and do not live in a devolved authority

### Asylum seekers are eligible for funding if:

- they have lived in the UK for six months or longer while their claim is being considered by the Home Office, and no decision on their claim has been made
- they are in the care of the local authority and receiving local authority support

In order to claim full funding for the learner we will require:

- Proof of income such as a wage slip if the learner is employed and earning less than the London Living Wage
- If the learner is unemployed, at least one of the following:
  - o Proof of benefits, if they are claiming benefits
  - o A commitment that they want to be employed
  - A commitment that they are seeking exceptional support with social integration as part of their course

#### 3. Ineligible learners

- those who are here without authority or lawful status;
- those who are resident in the United Kingdom on a student visa;
- those who are in the United Kingdom on holiday, with or without a visa;
- those who are in the UK on a sponsorship visa, including skilled worker visas and seasonal worker visas;
- those whose biometric residence permit or residence permit imposes a study prohibition or restriction on the individual

**Programme Manager's discretion**: If you have recruited your target number of learners or have 1 or 2 spaces that are unlikely to be filled and an individual ineligible for funding meets our priority learner profile, you can choose to accept them into the group. These learners will not count towards your learner targets. If it is decided to enrol a learner

ineligible for funding, Head of Service, Deputy Head of Service and MIS Managers are to be emailed.

Priority must be given to funded learners and the inclusion of ineligible learners must not adversely affect their learning. Ineligible learners will still be required to complete an enrolment form and entered on the register for Health and Safety purposes. You will need to clearly note in the comments section of the register that the learner is ineligible for funding and why you have accepted them into the group.
