What is working well in Camden?



Greenwood has a lot of opportunities e.g. drama groups



 Floating Support / community support is really useful to reduce isolation and do activities



 Blister packs are useful – it is easier to manage medication and avoid overdose



What is working well continued

 Supporting employment opportunities e.g. providers employing people with Learning Disabilities, a resident running a knitting group



 There is a quick response where there is a clinical need - where you need care from a health professional



- Good work with local councillors
 - We know who they are
 - They are able to help if things need to be looked at more seriously

 There are lots of referrals, and it is more difficult when waiting for funding to be agreed

• Funding and **procurement.** The steps that need to be taken to get new services e.g. setting up a contract



Getting computer systems to work together



• Lack of diversity across some services



What one change would you make in Camden if you had a magic wand?



- All computer systems talk to each other and share information between organisations
- More funding so:
 - Support workers can be paid better, more people apply for jobs and stay for longer



- So that providers don't have financial pressure and have to close
- So health staff can continue to offer drop in as needed rather than people getting a set number of sessions

- Change society completely
 - attitudes towards people with Learning Disabilities
 - so that people with Learning Disabilities are fully included into society
 - all mainstream activities are completely accessible and inclusive
 - there are meaningful jobs for people with Learning Disabilities
