Welcome and introductions




The co-chairs **Jon Horn** and **Stuart Dunn** welcomed everyone to the meeting

 staff don't always know about your health condition




We are writing an easy read advice letter – it will include useful contact numbers


NHS England have been in touch with CLDS to talk about a big new project

- knowing where public toilets are would be helpful, including Changing Places Toilets
- there is lots to do but problems with the way we let people know about activities



 there is not much variety in activities – open days to help people try new things



there is a choice of individual and group activities




- some services are not accessible

Feedback from carers at the meeting – main points

are we doing enough for young adult carers?



 could there be a supported living hub where parents can share their experiences?



 it can take years to find the right supported living and it can still fall through



 supported living is good if you get the right care package and it does what it says



 it's important to talk about having things in place for when the carer is no longer able to look after their loved one because of old age, illness or death



 without Camden Carers we wouldn't be able to link in with each other for support and friendship



There are online booklets to help family carers plan the future – they include advice on money, taking a break and what to do in an emergency

Carers can contact social workers and ask for a Carers Conversation to start a plan



Finding the right supported accommodation can take **3** to **4** years



They start talking about it when someone is **16**– not because the person is ready to move but because it takes a long time to arrange the right accommodation


Moving on

Small group discussions



The main points were

- keeping to a routine is important
- change should happen slowly



- visit accommodation before moving
- joined up working helps create support networks



- staffing
 - let staff know they are valued
 - encourage personal growth of staff
 - staff are not staying long
 - o there is low staff morale
 - staff not turning up



 better signposting to support while waiting to move



 better communication – let people know what is happening
